Judges Statement: The judges applaud not only the creative use of space, color and sustainable building practices, but also the meaningful transformation this project undertook to make a lasting impact on the community. Lessons can be learned about how to re-purpose an outdated, unwanted industrial space-- in this case taking a 100-year-old former lumber store and converting it into the first, tuition-free, public charter school in the Silicon Valley, serving over 1000 first-generation students. The thoughtful design allows for multi-functional room usage and enhanced learning, but even more impressive are the results that the design has inspired—currently a 100% high school graduation rate and a 95% college matriculation. A beautiful vision realized!
